Hannah Lawrence, PhD is a child clinical psychologist and assistant professor in the School of Psychological Science at Oregon State University. Clinically, Dr. Lawrence specializes in working with

children and adolescents and has practiced in high acuity settings including psychiatric inpatient and partial programs serving youth. Dr. Lawrence's research focuses on identifying novel risk factors for adolescent depression and suicide and developing new, scalable interventions to reduce this risk.
